Superintendent's Report-Tim Keteri

- The school resource officer is hired through the Sheriff's office but the Board can approve the part time position for the district. The admins were a part of the interviewing process and Leonard Scott will be taking the position at the end of February.
- The school van will need some repairs of around \$1000 to the computer.
- UP Engineering is helping work on the changes to the buildings. The Bond proposal will be on the August ballot. It is an extension of what is currently being taxed, rates would not increase.

Principal's Report-Kim Harris, South Range Elementary

- The MTSS team has been focusing on math recovery and writing skills.
- Next week, the Michigan Tech Ambassadors will be coming to work with K-6 students.
- Camp for 6th grade has some changes this year. Mrs. Sondgerath, JHS gym teacher, has taken over as director. Mrs. Irizarry, 1st grade teacher, has taken over the fundraising portion and will be doing a Little Caesars pizza kit fundraiser. Locations have been changed to Camp Lahti because it can offer more activities. The costs will be comparable, possibly less.
- January 26th will be the end of the 2nd marking period and an inservice day.
- The SRO officer will be helping work on building safety and traffic patterns for bus safety. Additional priority will be building relationships with students.

- He has been looking at school performance data. There will not be a change to the handbook's attendance policy. They are going to look at the existing employability points that this tracks.
